The Legal System



Nebraska County Courts

- 58 judges across Nebraska
- Jurisdiction: misdemeanor criminal cases; preliminary hearings in felony cases; civil cases involving less than \$53,000; small claims cases involving less than \$3,600; probate, guardianship, conservatorship, adoption, and eminent domain; also functions as juvenile court except in Douglas, Lancaster and Sarpy Counties

Nebraska Judges

- Appointment: merit selection system, judicial nominating commission
- Qualifications: U.S. citizen, at least 30, practice for 5+ years in NE, and currently admitted to practice in NE
- Retention: every 6 years

Nebraska District Courts

- 55 Judges across Nebraska
- Trial court of general jurisdiction
- Felony criminal cases; domestic relations cases; certain civil cases
- Appellate court on most cases from county court
- Appellate court for administrative agency appeals

Nebraska Court of Appeals

- 6 judges, panels of 3 hear appeals across Nebraska
- Intermediate Court of Appeals
- Chief Judge Frankie Moore
- Judges Inbody, Pirtle, Riedmann, Bishop and Arterburn



Nebraska Supreme Court

- Chief Justice and 6 Associate Justices
- Highest State Appellate Court
- Chief Justice Heavican

43-3710 Appointment of Volunteer, Procedure

- CASA can be appointed in any proceeding under 43-247 or 43-292 when, in the opinion of the judge:
 - a child who may be affected by such proceeding requires services that a volunteer can provide, and
 - the court finds that the appointment is in the best interests of the child.

43-3710(2) Appointment Procedure, Cont'd

- Requires a court order
- Order shall specify volunteer "as a friend of the court acting on the authority of the judge."
- Volunteer may then offer as evidence a written report with recommendations consistent with best interests of child
- Report is subject to "all pertinent objections."

ORDER APPOINTING CASA VOLUNTEER (COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATE)

A Minor Child Under 18 Years of Age.

NOW ON this _______ day of _______, 20_____, consistent with the Court Appointed Special Advocate Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 43-3701 *et seq.*, the court finds the above-referenced minor child requires services that a Court Appointed Special Advocate (hereinafter referred to as "CASA") can provide, and appointment of a CASA volunteer is in the best interests of said child.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that

a qualified volunteer under the supervision of the director and employees of the CASA program of Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska, should be and hereby is appointed as CASA volunteer and friend of the Court in the abovereferenced action. Said CASA volunteer shall:

Conduct an independent examination regarding the best interests of the child that will provide factual
information to the court regarding the child and the child's family, which may include interviews with and
observations of the child, interviews with other appropriate individuals, and the review of relevant records and
reports;

 Determine if an appropriate permanency plan has been created for the child, whether appropriate services are being provided to the child and the child's family, and whether a treatment plan is progressing in a timely manner;

 Prepare a written report to be distributed to the court and the parties to the proceeding and make recommendations consistent with the best interests of the child regarding placement, visitation, and appropriate services for the child and the child's family;

 Monitor the case to assure that the child's essential needs are being met and make every effort to attend all hearings, meetings, and any other proceeding concerning the case; and

5. Testify if called by any party or the court as a witness in a proceeding.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED as follows:

1. Consistent with the requirements of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 43-3713, all government agencies (including but not limited to the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services and its subcontractors), service providers, professionals, school districts, school personnel, parents, and families shall cooperate with all reasonable requests of the CASA volunteer. Upon presentation of a copy of this Order to any such entity or individual, said CASA volunteer shall be permitted to access the minor child and all relevant records and files of said entity and/or individual pertaining to the child's parent(s), guardian(s), and/or custodian(s) to include, but not limited to, all notes, correspondence, files, records, assessments, evaluations, test results, case plans, court reports, and any other relevant documentation.

 The CASA volunteer shall have access to the child and all court records pertaining to such child and the child's parent(s), guardian(s), and/or custodian(s).

3. The contents of any document, record, or other information relating to a case to which a CASA volunteer has access are confidential, and the CASA volunteer shall not disclose such information to persons other than the court, the parties to the action, and other persons authorized by the court.

 The CASA volunteer shall be notified in a timely manner of all hearings, meetings, and any other proceeding concerning the case.

5. This appointment shall continue pending further order of the court, and shall conclude upon termination of the court's jurisdiction over the child, upon discharge by the court, at the request of the director of the CASA Program of Scotts Bluff County with the court's approval, or upon successful motion of a party.

43-3710(3) CASA Appointment, cont'd

• "A memorandum of understanding between a court and a court appointed special advocate program is required in any county where a program is established and shall set forth the roles and responsibilities of the court appointed special advocate volunteer."

Memorandum of Understanding Between the Scotts Bluff County Court and CASA of Scotts Bluff County – September, 2015

Achieving the goals and mission of this CASA program requires the development of a good working relationship between the Court and the CASA Program. This Memorandum of Understanding identifies and clarifies that relationship.

SECTION I. CASES TO BE REFERRED TO CASA PROGRAM

IT IS AGREED that the following categories of dependency and neglect cases under the jurisdiction of the Court are most appropriate for referral to the CASA program. This does not exclude referral of cases outside of these categories.

- A. Children who are at risk of emotional, physical and /or sexual harm.
- B. Children who are victims of neglect and/or suffer from failure to thrive. C. Children who are or will be assigned to out of home placements.

SECTION II. ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY OF CASA VOLUNTEER

IT IS AGREED that the role and responsibility of the CASA volunteer are as follows:

- A. ROLE: A CASA volunteer is appointed as an Officer of the Court to provide the Court and other responsible persons with independent and objective information regarding the status of children involved in cases filed under Neb. Rev. Statues §43-247. Primarily, other responsible persons include the Protection and Safety Worker with Health and Human Services, the Guardian ad litem, the County Attorney, and the Attorneys for partices. Upon appointment, the CASA independently gathers and assesses information, develops recommendations and submits written and verbal reports which will be considered by the Court to aid in its decisions. The Court may direct the manner in which a CASA volunteer and any Guardian ad litem appointed in a case shall collaborate. The CASA volunteer will comply with the requirements of the CASA program and will abide by the restrictions contained in statute.
- B. RESPONSIBILITY: The mandate of the CASA volunteer is to assist the Court in assuring that the best interests of the child are served in relation to his or her right to a safe and permanent living environment. The CASA volunteer, in consultation with the CASA program staff, is responsible for reporting, as specified in Neb. Rev. Stat. §43-3712 any information regarding the continuing safety of the child. The CASA volunteer reports to and is directly supervised by the CASA program staff. The CASA program staff is responsible for the CASA volunteer's performance and is responsible for facilitating interactions among the CASA volunteer, Court and named parties.

43-3710 CASA Appointment, Conclusion

- CASA Volunteer's Appointment Concludes 1 of 4 ways:
- When the court's jurisdiction terminates (closed case)
- Upon discharge on court's own motion
- With court's approval, at request of program director
- Upon successful motion of a party (alleging acted inappropriately, unqualified, or unsuitable)

"YOU'RE FIRED ..."

- 43-3711: A CASA shall NOT—
 - –Accept any compensation
 - -Have any association that creates a conflict of interest
 - -Be related to any party or attorney in case
 - Be employed in position "that could result in a conflict of interest or give rise to appearance of a conflict"
 - -Use position to seek/accept gifts or special privileges

43-3714: YOU'RE FIRED & GO TO JAIL ...

- CASA Volunteer shall not disclose confidential information to persons other than the court, the parties to the action, and other persons authorized by the court. A violation is a Class III misdemeanor.
- 90 days in jail and/or up to \$500 fine

43-3712 The Good Stuff – Volunteer Duties

- Conduct independent examination regarding best interests of the child that will provide factual information to the court regarding the child & child's family.
 - -Interviews
 - -Observations
 - -Review of records

43-3712(1)(b) Volunteer Duties, Cont'd

- Determine if appropriate permanency plan exists
- Inquire whether appropriate services are provided
- Examine whether case plan is progressing timely
- Make recommendations for placement, visitation, and services for child and family
- Prepare written report for court and parties

43-3712(3), (4) & (5)

- CASA volunteer shall:
 - -Monitor case to assure child's essential needs met
 - -Make every effort to attend all hearings, meetings

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 - -Make every effort to attend all hearings, meetings AND YOU MIGHT GET IN THE ACTION ...

43-3712(5): "The volunteer may be called as a witness in a proceeding by any party or the court."

43-3713 CAN'T WE ALL JUST GET ALONG ...

§ 43-3713. Cooperation; notice required.

(1) All government agencies, service providers, professionals, school districts, school personnel, parents, and families shall cooperate with all reasonable requests of the court appointed special advocate volunteer. The volunteer shall cooperate with all government agencies, service providers, professionals, school districts, school personnel, parents, and families.

(2) The volunteer shall be notified in a timely manner of all hearings, meetings, and any other proceeding concerning the case to which he or she has been appointed. The court in its discretion may proceed notwithstanding failure to notify the volunteer or failure of the volunteer to appear.
